Please join the ArtCNU faculty and students in welcoming visiting artist Susan Mullally to campus in conjunction with the opening of her solo photography exhibition *Honor and Dignity: Older Black Women of the South*. A meet the artist reception and gallery talk by Mullally will be held in the Falk Gallery of Art, Ferguson Center, on Friday, Feb. 7 at 3 p.m.

Susan Mullally is an exhibiting artist whose work is widely published. Her portrait work is in many collections and has been exhibited across the country and in China. Mullally has produced four books and many monographs, notably, "What I Keep, Photographs of the New Face of Homelessness and Poverty", published by Baylor University Press, 2010, and "Hope & Dignity, Older Black Women of the South", funded by the National Endowment for the Humanities and published by Temple University Press, 1983, 1993.

At 3:30, after Susan Mullally's gallery talk about her work, the award winners for the 7th Annual CNU Juried Photography Exhibition will be announced. This exhibition in the Ferguson Hall Gallery features work by faculty, staff and students at CNU. It was juried by Thomas Moore, curator of photography for the Mariner's Museum.
