A talk by PHIL/RSTD professor, Dr. Matthew Homan about: Deus sive Natura: The God of Spinoza



Spinoza's God is not the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. He is not transcendent, acts without purpose, and material extension pertains to his nature. Spinoza's God is not a God to which one prays, or in which one has faith. Why, then, does Spinoza use the word "Deus" to characterize "Natura"? Was he just an atheist trying to avoid persecution? Or does he provide genuine, alternative conceptions of God and religion?

After a brief presentation, we will examine the issue further in dialogue.
