Please join us for the next installment of the 2011-12 Dean William Parks Colloquium exploration of the intersection of Art and Science. Our next speaker, Lauren Gunderson, will join us for a presentation and discussion of "The Arch of the Creative: How the Drama of Science Enlightens the Science of Drama." This event will be held on Wednesday, February 29th at 6:00 PM in Room 201 of the Freeman Center.

Ms. Gunderson's presentation will explore how scientific discovery, proof and application make great theater, as world famous plays like "Copenhagen" and "Arcadia" show. This presentation will break down the fundamental structure of drama to expose why science belongs on the stage, what theater does for science, and where both are taking each other.

Lauren Gunderson is a playwright, screenwriter and short-story author from Atlanta, Ga. She received her MFA in dramatic writing at NYU, Tisch and has worked with the Kennedy Center, South Coast Repertory, The O'Neill Playwrights Conference and the Bay Area Playwrights Festival. Her plays are performed nationwide and are published by Samuel French and Playscripts. Currently, she is working on a pilot for MTV. She is a resident at the Playwrights Foundation.
