The [Student Director](#) role is a premiere leadership position on CNU's campus, and serves as a 10-month internship experience for students in their Junior year or equivalent 3 years experience at a university. The internship runs from November-August and requires the hired individuals to plan and coordinate all of CNU's Orientation Programs (Setting Sail, SLAP, Changing Tides, Transfer Student Welcome Week, and Welcome Week). CNU hires six Student Directors, with a focus on program logistics, staff training, and transfer student programming.

Study Abroad Summer in Ireland and Scotland

We will have an information meeting on Wednesday September 16, from 5:45-6:45 in the McMurran 114 for those interested in a summer study abroad to Ireland and Scotland. There is more information on the Study Abroad web site where students may fill out an application. The class will focus on Celtic Christianity and its unique form of monasticism. We will visit shrines through Ireland and then cross the sea to follow in the tracks of Irish monks as they brought the Gospel to what became known as Scotland. We will backpack on the West Highland Way, walking from Glasgow to Fort William. We will visit Iona and the Isle of Skye. The class will run from June 22 to July 29.

Summer Class on the Appalachian Trail

We will have an information meeting on Wednesday September 16, from 5:45-6:45 in the McMurran 114 for those interested in a summer class hiking the Appalachian Trail. There is more information on the Study Abroad web site where students may fill out an application. Students will hike 50 miles of trail in Tennessee, cross the Virginia border and participate in the Trail Days festival in Damascus, walk up into the Grayson Highlands and camp among the wild ponies about a mile above sea level. Students will be conducting ethnographic research, interviewing thru-hikers who are walking from Georgia to Maine. The class will run from May 9 till May 24. The program fee is \$350.

Foreign Puzzle follows dancer and choreographer Sharon Marroquin as she endures intensive breast cancer treatments and explores her fear of death through the creation of a 90 minute dance titled, The Materiality of Impermanence. The dance becomes Sharon's only outlet, allowing her to escape the daily pressures of the disease and life as a single working parent, and shapes her perceptions about life as she fights to heal her body and mind.
