




CNU faculty, honorees and their families gather in the Ferguson Center for the Arts for the Latin Honors Convocation.



CNU Rector John Conrad welcomes the commencement audience.





University First Lady Rosemary Trible embraces a graduate after she receives her degree.




CNU ROTC graduates recite the oath of office and become the newest second lieutenants in the U.S. army.

Baseball Sets New Mark




Captains baseball enjoyed a record-setting season winning 39 games en route to a No. 1 national ranking, a USA South Conference championship and another NCAA Tournament berth.


CNU a Top-Three School in Textbook Drive

CNU has built one the finest undergraduate voice programs in the country.


In this year's statewide National Association of Teachers of Singing competition, which includes the best voice majors from every school in Virginia, CNU captured three first-place awards: Caroline Scruggs in Freshmen Women, Wesley Evans in Junior Men and Marshall Severin in Junior Men Music Theatre. CNU also earned five second-place awards: Rachel Sowinski in Freshmen

Women, Renae Erichsen in Freshmen Women Music Theatre, Michael Baggett in Senior Men, Marshall Severin in Junior Men and Wesley Evans in Junior Men Music Theatre. Winning Honors (third place) were Caroline Scruggs in Freshmen Women Music Theatre, Paul Keene in Sophomore Men, and Emi Frantz and Victoria Myers in Senior Women. CNU took home half of all the possible first- and second-place awards.

The CNU Indoor Drumline won the gold trophy in the Atlantic Indoor Competition Championships followed by the CNU Indoor Guard, which won the bronze, beating teams from the University of Virginia, The College of William & Mary, and other schools across Virginia.

In 2012 the Marching Captains will participate in London's New Year's Day Parade, the Women's Chorus will sing in the United Kingdom and the Chamber Choir in Germany and Italy. This summer, voice and piano majors will be studying and performing in Cornwall and at The University of Oxford in what we hope will soon become an ongoing national summer music program.


Chapel Constuction Begins
