This year's artists include Metropolitan Opera tenor Lawrence Brownlee, Grammy-winner Bobby McFerrin, Tony-nominee Kelli O'Hara, Broadway singer Heather Parcells, and male a cappella sensation Straight No Chaser in addition to faculty Costanza Cucarro, Tim Noble, and Ray Fellman of Indiana University and Gary Kline of Carnegie Mellon University.

Students sing in masterclasses, coach with pianists/coaches from NYC, give recitals, and study voice physiology, performance health, Yoga, acting, stage movement, audition techniques, and more.
