Whereas, Elizabeth Frances Jones, Professor of Classical Studies, has served Christopher Newport University as a respected and admired member of the faculty for thirty-five years, from 1967 through her retirement at the close of the 2001-2002 academic year; and

Whereas, In this time, Professor Jones has contributed significantly to the academic development of her students as an engaging, creative, and tireless teacher and mentor; to the evolution of her department through her creation and development of the curriculum in classical studies, including highly regarded undergraduate courses in Latin, ancient history, mythology, and word origins; and to the well-being of her community as a selfless and articulate voice for the value of the classics in modern society and for the essential contributions of classical studies to the academic development of all liberally educated citizens ; and

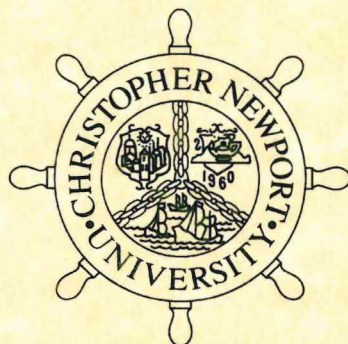
Whereas, Professor Jones is recognized by her colleagues as having represented the finest characteristics of the academic profession; and

Whereas, In light of such service and accomplishments, her decision to retire from the Faculty of Christopher Newport University has caused the Department of Modern and Classical Languages and Literatures, the Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the Faculty Senate, and the Provost of the University to recommend that her long professional association with Christopher Newport University be continued beyond the date of her retirement; therefore be it
