Please join me in congratulating each of these faculty members on their significant accomplishments and recognition by the Board of Visitors.

The Board of Visitors will confer the degree Doctor of Laws, *Honoris Causa*, upon U.S. Circuit Judge J. Harvie Wilkinson, III, at commencement exercises on May 10, 2003, in honor of his long and distinguished service to the Commonwealth and the nation.

The Board also set tuition and fees for next year. As you know, the General Assembly and the Governor authorized colleges and universities to annualize the mid-year tuition increases adopted last spring. They then capped tuition and comprehensive fee increases for next year at five percent. However, they authorized the Board of Visitors to increase tuition and fees beyond the five percent cap to cover the university's share of the salary and benefit increases that are effective November 25, 2003. The General Assembly also imposed a new fee on out-of-state students to support the construction of capital projects funded by the State and allowed institutions to increase fees to support authorized capital projects funded by student fees. The detailed tuition and fee schedule for next year is provided below. The 2002-03 tuition rate includes the annualized mid-year tuition increase.
