I went to Barcelona knowing absolutely no one and I left having a Spanish family and lifelong friends who I still talk to all the time. WAYS TO GO ABROAD

- * When looking for a Study Abroad Program, you can take courses for your major, minor, core, areas of inquiry or elective credit.
- * Someone from every major has studied abroad at CNU. Check out the website or office to see options for your major.
- * If you want to go to a specific location, you might need to consider some courses outside your major.
- * By remaining open to completing non-major requirements abroad, you may gain flexibility for when, where and for how long you stay.
- * Go with a group of CNU students and CNU faculty leaders, or study at a university abroad with other US, international, or local students.



Last year, over \$250,000 in scholarships were awarded! There are several types of awards. However, there is a limit of one award per student, so a student may not receive a second award even if studying abroad a second time. Students, who are qualified for more than one, will receive the best award and forfeit the smaller award. Applications are available in the study abroad office and the deadlines are the same as the program deadline. The types of awards include:

Open to all students to apply:

- CNU in Scotland Program Scholarship
- General Funds for Excellence scholarship

Only students selected during CNU admission:

- President's Leadership Program Scholarship
- Honors Program Scholarship
- Oxford Prestigious Scholar Experience

For example, a course approved for transfer as FNAR 205: Digital Photography can be applied to the Creative Expressions category. However, a course approved as FNAR 2XX will not be applied an Area of Inquiry.

Global and Multicultural Perspectives: Italy, China, Ireland, England, Costa Rica, Netherlands, New Zealand

Western Traditions: Ireland, Czech Republic, Spain, England, Italy
