CAB presents...G Yamazawa (Spoken Word Poet)

Born in Durham, NC and raised by Japanese immigrants, George Masao Yamazawa, Jr. is widely considered one of the top young spoken word artists in the country. "G" is a National Poetry Slam Champion, Individual World Poetry Slam Finalist, and Southern Fried Champion, and has toured in over 50 American cities and 5 European countries. Winner of Kollaboration DC 2012, Audience Choice Award Recipient of the Inaugural Kollaboration Star and 2013 Kundiman Fellow, G has been featured at the Sundance Film Festival, Bonnaroo Music Festival, TV One's Season 3 of Verses and Flow, the Pentagon, and the White House Initiative on Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders. His poetry has been published in Beltway Quarterly, Asian Fortune Magazine, and27 Views of Durham, and has shared stages with Sonia Sanchez, Michelle Kwan, Danny Glover, and VP Joe Biden. An advocate for youth empowerment, G also has extensive experience as a teachi ng artist facilitating writing/performance workshops for inner city youth in the Washington, DC public school system through Split This Rock, a nationally recognized non-profit organization with a focus in political poetry.

Dr Santoro Presents Screening of German Propaganda Films: "Triumph of the Will" and "Day of Victory"

Wednesday, 2/17, 6:30pm - MCM 101 - screened in their original German language with complete English language subtitle translations and identifications

The CNU Film Studies Minor is hosting two screenings of a new Blu Ray release of German director Leni Riefenstahl's propaganda films Triumph of the Will and Day of Victory. CNU President Emeritus and Distinguished Professor of History Dr. Anthony R. Santoro provided the sub-title revised English language translations of speeches in the film as well as the sub-title identifications of all significant personalities and organizations seen. He also did a second track on the film with suppressed sound on which he gives a lecture on the films as they are being screened. The screenings will be on two successive Wednesday evenings (February 10 and February 17) at 6:30 p.m. in MCM 101. On February 10 the films will be screened in their entirety but with their sound tracks suppressed accompanied by Dr. Santoro's commentary. On February 17 the films will be screened in their original German language with complete English language sub-title translations and identifications.

Triumph of the Will is a documentary record commissioned personally by Adolf Hitler of the 1934 Nazi Party Congress that took place in Nuremberg in September. It is considered the most famous propaganda film of all time. Day of Victory is a much shorter film produced the next year, also by Leni Riefenstahl, because the German Armed Forces (the Wehrmacht) complained to Hitler that Triumph of the Will gave virtually no coverage whatever to the German Army, Navy, and Air Force and, instead, focused entirely on formations, organizations, and personalities of the Nazi Party.

This just released 2016 Blu Ray DVD from Synapse films is the work of a new and complete restoration done by Robert

Harris of Film Preserve Limited with all of the editorial work done by CNU's Dr. Santoro. Previous restorations by Mr. Harris are Lawrence of Arabia and My Fair Lady.

The screening is open to all free of charge. Dr. Santoro will be present to answer any questions on the history of the film, its connection to Adolf Hitler's Third Reich, and the task of restoration.
