#### **Very Important Benefits Update**

Great news — health care premiums did not increase!

Open enrollment for health insurance and the Flexible Benefits Program begins April 15, 2011, and ends May 16, 2011. You may enroll, waive or make changes to your existing health care coverage during this time.

This year, many new rules apply to dependent eligibility for health insurance. Effective July 1, 2011:

- Eligible dependent children may be covered up to the end of the year in which they turn age 26;
- Children may be married;
- May or may not reside full-time with the employee or other natural or adoptive parents;
- May or may not be away at school;
- And, for these situations, the employee's financial support no longer applies to eligibility.

However, documentation for dependents added is required, such as, birth certificates, adoption papers, court orders.

#### TRAINING SEMINAR SCHEDULE

• Monday, April 18: \*Understanding the Employee Grievance and Discipline Process 9-11 a.m.
