Faculty Senate Resolution 2010-2011-02 Emerita Statement for Professor Betty Lockhart Anglin

Whereas, Betty Lockhart Anglin, Professor of Fine Art & Art History, has announced her decision to retire from active university teaching and research after nearly forty years at Christopher Newport University, and

Whereas Professor Anglin has enriched the lives and visual culture of the CNU community through the beauty of her watercolors, and has dedicated her career to sharing her love of painting with thousands of students, raising their aesthetic awareness and enhancing their creative skills, and

Whereas Professor Anglin has served Christopher Newport University as both Director of the Department of Fine Art and Art History and Director of the Falk Gallery of Art during the department's early years and whose leadership was instrumental in the development in the department, and

Whereas Professor Anglin's paintings have been the subject of numerous solo and group exhibitions throughout the state of Virginia, including recognition by the Virginia Watercolor Society, and

Whereas the watercolors of Professor Anglin hang in numerous private and corporate collections across the country as well as in the High Museum of Art in Atlanta, the Parthenon in Nashville, the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, and the Chrysler Museum in Norfolk, and

Whereas Professor Anglin has served as a role model and mentor to hundreds of young teachers, touching the lives of generations of K-12 art students across the state of Virginia, and

Whereas Professor Anglin has actively contributed to the development of young artists of Virginia through her participation in both the Governors School for the Arts and the Summer Institute for the Arts of Newport News, and

Whereas her efforts in these endeavors have led to her nomination for the Governor's Award for her profound contribution to the arts in Virginia, and

Whereas Professor Anglin has shared her talents with both the Lifelong Learning Society and the Peninsula Fine Art Center by teaching for them for the past twenty years, and

Whereas, through her generosity, she has donated both her time and her art to numerous charitable causes throughout Hampton Roads, and

Whereas she has also shown her continued commitment to the welfare, artistic and intellectual development of her students by establishing the Betty Anglin Freshman Alumni Scholarship and the Ernie Anglin Award,

Therefore Be It Resolved that upon her retirement Professor Betty Lockhart Anglin be accorded the rank of Professor of Fine Art and Art History Emeritus, thus ensuring her continued professional

association with the University, the Department of Fine Art and Art History, her colleagues and her students.
