

Field Trip to Washington, D. C. Georgia O'Keeffe Exhibit and Impressionists at Argenteuil National Gallery of Art SATURDAY, June 24, 2000

Board the chartered coach, with a Covington Tours escort, in the Student Center parking lot at 7:15 a.m. for a 7:30 a.m. departure to Washington, D. C. No breakfast will be provided; beverage and snacks will be served later in the day.

We will have lunch at 11:30 a.m. at Old Ebbitt Grille in D. C. Please make your menu choice below.

After lunch we will visit the National Museum of Women in the Arts for a brief guided tour. Then we will proceed to the National Gallery of Art to see two exhibits. These will both be self-guided. The first is "O'Keeffe on Paper." Approximately fifty of Georgia O'Keeffe's most stunning watercolors, charcoals, and pastels, assembled from public institutions, as well as rarely seen works from private collections are presented, including landscapes, still lifes, figures and portraits. There are also some of the most haunting abstractions of American modernism.

The second exhibit is "Impressionists at Argenteuil." There are more than 50 impressionist paintings by six influential artists – Eugene Boudin, Gustave Caillebotte, Edouard Manet, Claude Monet, Auguste Renoir and Alfred Sisley. The exhibit explores their fascination with the small town of Argenteuil just outside Paris, which became the inspiration for, and the subject of, many of the most lyrical, dazzling, and progressive paintings of the day.

We will stop at Pentagon City Mall for dinner or shopping on your own. Departure for Newport News will be at 7:00 p.m. with an anticipated arrival on the CNU campus of 10:00 p.m.

The price of the trip is \$75.00 and the deadline for registering is **Thursday**, **June 1**, **2000**. During the return trip, the tour guide will accept tips for the driver.
