Denny O'Neil is one of the most popular comics writers of the past fifty years. He is perhaps best known for his reinvention of the Green Lantern and Green Arrow in the early 1970s, which allowed him and artist, Neal Adams to engage important social issues of the day. O'Neil also worked on Batman in the 1970s and returned the character to his darker roots following the success of the campy television series. While at DC, O'Neil also enjoyed successful runs on Wonder Woman, the Justice League of America, and Superman. Later at Marvel Comics, he served as writer on Amazing Spider-Man, Iron Man, and Daredevil before moving on to become editor of several popular titles in the mid-1980s. Returning to DC, O'Neil enjoyed a lengthy tenure as editor of the various Batman titles in the late 1980s and 1990s. He has also received wide acclaim for his reimagining of the 1930s pulp hero the Shadow. More recently, he has published the DC Guide to Writing Comics and taught courses on writing comics at the School of Visual Arts in New York City. He has won countless honors and awards in the comics industry, and in 2014, was inducted into the Will Eisner Hall of Fame.
