APPOINTMENT TO FILL POSITION OF

ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF STUDENT PERSONNEL SERVICES

(DIRECTOR, OFFICE OF VETERANS AFFAIRS)

Christopher Newport College

Because of the large number of veterans served by Christopher Newport College, it is necessary to employ a full-time person as Assistant Director of Student Personnel Services with special responsibilities as Director of the Office of Veterans Affairs.

This position is funded by a grant from the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Visitors of the College of William and Mary and Christopher Newport College hereby approves the following appointment:

ROGER J. LAVERRIERE, Instructor (non-teaching), at a salary of \$5,250 (based upon an annual rate of \$9,000).

Prior to his current position as an Assistant to the Vice President for Marketing at the Pepperell Trust Company, Mr. Laverriere was employed by Old Dominion University to assist with a federally-funded Veteran's Cost of Instruction Program (VCIP) which involved considerable public service and public speaking responsibilities. He planned and instituted the "ODU Outreach" program, providing information to veterans and dependents in the Tidewater area with regard to available benefits. Mr. Laverriere also held part-time responsibilities during his tour of duty in the Navy working at ODU in the offices of Student Records and Admissions where he assisted with computer-based registration procedures throughout the academic year. Mr. Laverriere is twenty-five years old and is married.
