Poet Laureate of California

Dear students, faculty and staff,

On April 19, the Phi Beta Kappa faculty at CNU will welcome poet Dana Gioia for two special events.

At 11am he will lead a discussion on writing poetry in the Blechman Room of Trible Library.

At 1:30pm he will deliver a lecture in Gaines Theater entitled "Why Beauty Matters---Not Just in Art but in Politics and Society."

Both events are free and open to the public. The lecture counts as an Honors campus intellectual activity as well as a PLP Passport event.

Dana Gioia is the Judge Widney Professor of Poetry and Public Culture at the University of Southern California. From 2001 to 2009 he served as chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts, where he brought enormous public attention to the importance of reading and arts participation. Gioia has published five full-length collections of poetry, as well as eight chapbooks. His poetry collection, Interrogations at Noon, won the 2002 American Book Award. An influential critic as well, Gioia's 1991 volume Can Poetry Matter?, which was a finalist for the National Book Critics Circle award, is credited with helping to revive the role of poetry in American public culture. In 2014 Gioia won the Aiken-Taylor Award for lifetime achievement in American poetry, and in 2015 he was appointed the State Poet Laureate of California by Governor Jerry Brown.







