

### Captains Basketball Team – Best Season Ever




Teammates celebrate after winning the Dixie Conference Championship.

On March 2, for the first time, Christopher Newport College hosted (and won! 81-71) an NCAA Division III Basketball Tournament game against Emory and Henry College.

This highlight was the culmination of the team's best season (24-5) which lead them to capture the Dixie Conference Championship for the fourth time in the last six years.

Senior Lamont Strothers lead the Captains this year and was named the South's No. 1 player for the third straight year. He was also named Dixie Conference Player of the Year for the second time, tournament MVP for the third time, and a first team All-Conference Player for the fourth time.

Strothers ended his career with a point total of 2,709 to place him third on the all-time Division III list and, most impressively, his 116 consecutive games in double figures is the highest in NCAA history and earned him recognition in the March 18 issue of Sports Illustrated.

### **Campus Supports Operation Desert Storm**

The CNC campus banded together to provide support and information for students, faculty, and staff about the troops in the Middle East. Over the course of the spring semester the campus offered opportunities to get involved by sponsoring a teach-in, sending Valentine messages to family and friends overseas, and joining support groups for those with similar concerns.

The United Campus Ministries hosted a three hour teach-in on January 23 to supply information on the crisis and furnish insight about its ramifications and probable outcome. Students, faculty, and staff crowded the Campus Center Lounge to hear various perspectives on the war and ask questions concerning it. Moderated by Dr. Mario D.

Mazzarella, the teach-in considered moral, ethical, military, and personal aspects of the conflict.

Also sponsored by United Campus Ministries was a major effort to send comfort to the men and women who were far from home on Valentine's Day. Hundreds signed Valentine messages which were collected and sent to the Middle East to keep spirits high both here and abroad.

To further comfort family and friends of the troops in Iraq, the Student Development Center, in coordination with the faculty of the social work program, formed support groups. These sessions were free to students, faculty, and staff and met on Wednesday and Friday evenings to discuss concerns and personal reactions to the war.



Thanks to these groups, and many others, military troops, including many CNC students who were called to duty, will return to a community that was eager to show its support and concern, and equally eager to welcome them home.

CNC continues to attain visibility for its emphasis on international studies. The College sponsored a workshop on International Education and Curriculum which was wellattended by many educators from across the state.

The Fall 1990 National Teacher Exam Scores for CNC were excellent. The results of the Professional Knowledge test placed CNC in the top one-fifth of all institutional mean scores in the United States. Furthermore, higher mean scores in the early childhood and middle school specialties support the belief that our education graduates are considered among the best hired locally.

You will also be pleased to know that our accounting students passed the Fall 1990 CPA exam with flying colors! CNC students performed among the best, along with students from the University of Richmond, VCU, W&M, and Emory and Henry College in passing the CPA exam on the first try.

The Minority Student Association held a number of successful events celebrating Black History Month, including a commemorative program honoring Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., a gospel concert, and a fashion show.

The College community mourns the passing of two Board members (Mary Alice Spear and Dewey Wilson), our continuing education director (Agnes Braganza), and a former faculty member (James Shaver). Detailed articles of their service to the College can be found on page 5.

As I finalize this letter to you, it is just a few hours after President Bush announced our victory in the war against Saddam Hussein. Many local military personnel participated in this effort. When they come home, all those connected in any way with CNC will be honored here at the College.


#### Basketball

# Way to Go Captains!

## Technology and Services of Captain John Smith Library Expand

The staff of the Captain John Smith Library welcomes alumni and the community to take advantage of services offered. "Our library is here to serve the College and the alumni first and then the community," says Wendell Barbour, Library Director.

Not only does Smith Library provide access to a large number of resources in its circulating collection, but the Reference Department, the Periodicals/Microforms Department, and the Media Department all provide special materials and services available to alumni.

The Reference Department contains bibliographical access to the library's 240,000 volumes. A reference librarian is available to answer questions and offer assistance. Also located here are a multitude of information sources. The only reference department service not available to alumni and community patrons is on-line database searching. Due to its high cost, this service is limited to faculty and student needs.

The Periodicals/Microforms Department holds current and back issues of nearly 1,500 magazines and newspapers. Numerous business journals and indexes are available here. Because the cost of replacing periodicals is so high, they do not circulate outside the library. Instead, coin-operated copiers are provided.

In the Media Department, located at the back of the library, patrons will find individual listening and viewing stations for over 6,000 videocassettes, recordings, filmstrips, and audiovisual materials available.

The library's book stacks contain volumes for research, browsing, and some children's books in the juvenile collection, which may be borrowed, free of charge, for up to four weeks. Alumni may also suggest that the

library purchase specific titles through a request system. Each request will be carefully considered to meet the curricular needs of the College and to improve the quality of materials added to the collection.

Even in the midst of budget cuts, "our library has come a long way," says Mr. Barbour. In the past few years the number of books and periodicals has doubled. Most recently, the library has installed an automated system that uses barcodes, allowing books to be easily cataloged and checked out.

The library staff intends to continue this

growth and will soon replace the card catalog with on-line computer terminals that will allow patrons to access bibliographical information at the touch of a key.

In the meantime, the library staff is working hard to serve patrons and provide information fast. "One of our main goals," says Mr. Barbour, "is ...to supply as many resources as possible to help the College's students, faculty, and alumni find the information they need."

# Faculty Spotlight Dr. H. Marshall Booker – Popular Economist


Dr. H. Marshall Booker, Professor of Economics and Director of the Bureau of Business and Economic Research at CNC, has had a 20 year relationship with the College and with the media. When local radio and TV stations want economic explanations, they call on Dr. Booker. When The Daily Press wants annual economic predictions, they phone Dr. Booker. And when CNC students and faculty have questions about economic issues, they knock on Dr. Booker's office door.

"This is the age of the economist," he says, and for the past eight years, the second week of January has found Dr. Booker giving his Annual Economic Forecast, an event cosponsored by CNC, The Daily Press and Rancorn, Wildman, Krause, Brezinski Architects. It is free to the public and includes a continental breakfast, and, in the last two years, the meeting room, which holds up to 150 people, has been standing room only.

Ask anyone on campus the reason for Dr. Booker's popularity and they will say it is his light and witty manner of speech coupled with his rare insight. Ask Dr. Booker, and he

will credit it to good fortune. "I'm very fortunate in that I grew up here," he says. "That gives me some additional insight into the economy. I'm fortunate also in that when I first came back to the area in 1969, I made contact with the media." Certainly, the Peninsula and Christopher Newport College in particular, are fortunate to get his predictions and advice first hand.

Between hosting economic discussions, making appearances before the media, and editing the quarterly *Peninsula Business and Economic Report* put out by the College, Dr. Booker is a busy man. But his first and last love is teaching. He teaches on every level, from money classes for first graders, to his work at CNC, to graduate level courses at the College of William and Mary. And he is as amiable and insightful in the classroom as he is before the public, keeping a delicate balance between seriousness and humor that brings the economy to an understandable level. "I began teaching because I wanted to," hesays proudly. "I stay because I love it."



# Admissions Requirements Revised

Since 1970, when CNC gained four-year status, the size of the student body has grown each year, with few exceptions. While these and numerous other changes were occurring, the admission requirements for entering freshmen remained fairly constant. The faculty Admissions Committee conducted a thorough review of those requirements during the 1989-1990 academic year and recommended that certain changes be made to some of the requirements.

Until 1990, the College required that freshman applicants present a "C" average in high school academics, a minimum total score of 800 on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT), and graduation in the upper-half of the graduating class. The new requirements, effective with applicants for freshman admission to the fall semester of 1991, include an expectation that applicants have completed a college-preparatory curriculum, such as Virginia's 23-unit Advanced Studies Diploma program, or its equivalent, graduation in the upper-half of their class, and a minimum score of 400 in each of the verbal and mathematics portions of the SAT.

Applicants who otherwise meet admis-

sions requirements but whose SAT verbal or mathematics score falls between 350-400, will be required to enroll in the appropriate noncredit, college-preparatory course (English 020 or Mathematics 030) as a condition of their admission; those who otherwise meet admissions requirements but whose verbal and mathematics SAT scores fall between 300 and 350 will be admitted, but limited to a fixed curriculum of thirteen credits, the curriculum to include English 020 (Strategies for College Reading and Writing), Mathematics 030 (Basic Mathematics), Philosophy 101 (Critical Thinking), and College Studies 101 (The College Experience: Becoming a Master Student).

According to Robert Laverriere, Associate Dean of Admissions, the new program has been well-received at local high schools by both prospective students and their parents. Students understand the rationale behind the program and are even enthusiastic about it. LaVerriere also commented that together with strengthened advising and better placement testing of incoming freshmen, the new admissions requirements will result in more successful freshmen at CNC.

# In Memory of...

### **Agnes Braganza**

Excerpted from a Memorial to Agnes by Carolyn Lawrence, Campus Minister.

Agnes Braganza, Director of Continuing Education, lost a two-year battle with bone cancer on November 16. At the age of 53 and with her doctorate little more than a year old, Agnes was one of those cut down in the prime of life. Her death was truly a tragedy.

Yet her life was anything but tragic. She seemed to have an innate grasp of the Biblical injunction to "choose life" - not in some narrow sense but in every aspect of the word. Choosing life for her meant political involvement, for she understood that the political arena is where the great decisions about life are made. Choosing life meant a commitment to education, her own as well as others', for education is what gives quality to life. Choosing life meant devotion to her family and meant sacrifice of time for them, dedication to their futures, and enjoyment of special family customs and celebrations. Choosing life meant support for all those who needed her help whether it was encouraging a new campus ministry at CNC, paying tuition for a needy student, or helping someone find a job. Her energy in choosing life was contagious. Never

at a loss for ideas nor for ways to implement them, Agnes could and did pull others along with her. She gave credit to others, particularly those with whom she worked, and had a delightful way of being happy at the successes of friends and co-workers.

Agnes chose life with courage and, near the end of her life, even heroic courage. She was determined to beat her cancer or at least to go down fighting and in good humor. Surely, she accomplished the latter, for in her dying days, having accepted her imminent death, she told her family, "You'd better warn God that I'm coming!"

A memorial service was held for Agnes on December 12, 1990 in the Campus Center. In his closing comments, President Santoro remarked, "While it is natural for us to feel the pain of loss and sorrow at Agnes' death, we are comforted by the warmth that her glow has given this community. She will be in our hearts and in the soul of this institution for a very long time."

Mr. Shaver, in February of 1989, was granted emeritus status by the CNC Board of Visitors in honor of his dedication to the College throughout his career. Although his loss is greatly felt, his contribution to CNC will never be forgotten.

### **Outstanding Athletes Honored**

The Hall of Fame Selection Committee has chosen five more of the finest athletes in CNC history to join the 12 already adorning the Hall of Fame plaque in Ratcliffe Gymnasium. The newest members were inducted at half time of the men's basketball game against Methodist on February 1, 1991.

The selection of these five members should come as no surprise: Their merits are outstanding.

Basketball player Steve Brown, a two-time first team All-Dixie Conference selection, scored a career total of 1,085 points, leading his team in scoring twice between 1973 and 1977.

Coach Vince Brown guided the Lady Captains track team to national recognition. Under his leadership they won six consecutive NCAA Division III National Championships,

placing them among the ranks of only 17 other teams in NCAA history.

Track star Silvia Douglas was CNC's first female NCAA All-American—then went on to win the award six more times.

Basketball player Gwynn Drewry, once a member of CNC's 1979-80 women's basketball team, which competed in the AIAW National Championship, still holds rank as fifth in career scoring and third in rebounding.

Tennis player and Coach Vicki Nebinger played in the NCAA Division III National Championship and later coached the Lady Captains for three years. She is still considered one of the top players in the area.

Each new member has received a replica of a personal plaque displayed in the main lobby of Ratcliffe Gym noting their outstanding athletic achievements.


