# Student Veterans Organization Veterans Week

MONDAY: At the table in the DSU, the SVO will have an honor banner for students, faculty, staff, and visitors. Names of family or friends who have served in the military can be written on the banner. That evening we will host a kick off event/informational session 6:00 - 7:00 pm in the DSU Washington room. On Tuesday, the honor banner will be hung in the DSU.

<u>TUESDAY</u>: The SVO will be hosting a panel talk/discussion with veterans from WWII through the present. They will be discussing their experiences and time in the military. They will also compare each others experiences and connect how they are different and which are similar. This will take place 12:30 to 1:30 in Freeman 201. Free pizza for attendees while it lasts.

<u>WEDNESDAY</u> (<u>Veteran's Day</u>): The SVO will be on hand to give out red, white, and blue ribbons as well as decorate the great lawn with flags. At 11:00 am the University will host its wreath laying ceremony and color guard/TAPS presentation. That afternoon, the SVO will be hosting a movie screening for the IVET Organization. IVET is a local organization dedicated to helping veterans overcome issues they face as they return home. The movie is called Project 22 and is about two veterans who undertake a motorcycle journey across America. Along the way they talk with other veterans about issues they face and what alternate methods of therapy are out there. The founder of IVET, retired Brigadier General Jeff Horne will be on hand to speak and answer questions. This will take place in Forbes 1022 from 6:30 to 9:00 pm.

<u>THURSDAY</u>: The SVO will be holding a ceremony to honor students, faculty, and staff of CNU who have served in the military. This will happen in the DSU Ballroom from 12:30 TO 2:30 pm.

The SVO will also be hosting the Thursday Night Trivia in the Crows Nest. Some of the questions will have a military

<u>FRIDAY</u>: Our last event will be held in the Gaines Theater in the Freeman Center from 1:00 to 2:00 pm. This will be a talk given by retired Lieutenant Colonel and Distinguished Service Cross recipient Richard J. Rinaldo who is also a Life Long Learner here at CNU. He will be speaking about his experiences in military and combat during the Vietnam War.

# Mathematics Colloquium - The Exceptional Laguerre Polynomials

The Exceptional Laguerre Polynomials
Dr. Jessica Stewart Kelly - Christopher Newport University

Abstract: While studying exactly and quasi-exactly solvable potentials in quantum mechanics, the following Bochner-type problem arose: to nd all sequences of polynomials fpngN0nA, with deg(pn) = n and jAj < 1, which are solutions of a second order di erential equation of the form [y](x) = a2(x)y00(x) + a1(x)y0(x) + a0(x)y(x); are orthogonal with respect to a positive weight function w (x) on a real interval; and all have moments f ng of w (x) exist and are nite. Up to a complex change of variables, the only such sequences are the \exceptional" polynomial sequences of Laguerre, Jacobi, and Hermite. We will discuss the properties of the exceptional Laguerre polynomials; in particular, the relationship of the exceptional Laguerre polynomial system to

the classical Laguerre polynomial system and the spectral analysis of the associated di erential expression.


