Poet Laureate of California Leading Discussion on Poetry: 11:00am-12:00pm

All students are invited to a discussion on writing poetry to be led by poet Dana Gioia on Tuesday, April 19, from 11am to 12pm in the Blechman Reading Room of Trible Library.

Dana Gioia is the Judge Widney Professor of Poetry and Public Culture at the University of Southern California. From 2001 to 2009 he served as chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts, where he brought enormous public attention to the importance of reading and arts participation. Gioia has published five full-length collections of poetry, as well as eight chapbooks. His poetry collection, Interrogations at Noon, won the 2002 American Book Award. An influential critic as well, Gioia's 1991 volume Can Poetry Matter?, which was a finalist for the National Book Critics Circle award, is credited with helping to revive the role of poetry in American public culture. In 2014 Gioia won the Aiken-Taylor Award for lifetime achievement in American poetry, and in 2015 he was appointed the State Poet Laureate of California by Governor Jerry Brown.

The lecture will take place on Tuesday, April 19, from 1:30-2:45pm in Gaines Theater. This lecture counts as an Honors intellectual activity and a PLP Passport Event.

Dana Gioia is the Judge Widney Professor of Poetry and Public Culture at the University of Southern California. From 2001 to 2009 he served as chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts, where he brought enormous public attention to the importance of reading and arts participation.
