Faculty Senate: Questions for Interviews with Provost Candidates

Note: The interview should last approximately 45 minutes. There are eight questions, so we should allot approximately 5-6 minutes to each question.

- 1. Please give us a *brief* overview of your career to date.
- 2. How do you define liberal learning? Compare/contrast a Tier-1 or Tier-2 university to your vision of liberal learning for CNU.
- 3. How would you sustain, promote and encourage a climate of university-wide undergraduate and graduate intellectual engagement?
- 4. How do you envision your relationship with the Faculty Senate? with the faculty at large?
- 5. What is your approach to evaluating faculty for tenure and promotion? What expectations for teaching, service, and professional development do you think are appropriate for the faculty?
 - a. (follow-up) How do you gauge rigor?
- 6. As you know, one of the goals of this university is to change the teaching load from 4-4 to 3-4 in the immediate future, and possibly to 3-3 at a later date. How will the shift in teaching loads affect your approach to evaluating faculty for tenure and promotion?
- 7. What role do you envision for a professional school, and its faculty, in a liberal arts university? How should each of the two programs and faculties contribute to the other?
- 8. Are there inherent differences in how faculty for a professional school or the liberal arts and sciences should be recruited and managed?
