# Department of Mathematics Colloquium: The Brachistochrone Problem - 12:20pm

Tuesday, October 6th, 2015, 12:20 -1:20 p.m. Luter 372

The Brachistochrone Problem", presented by Andrew Will

Abstract: Following the birth of calculus in the 17th Century, the brachistochrone problem is a key indicator of the rapid advancement of mathematics resulting from this revolutionary new field. The problem proposes a rather simple question, "Given two points A and B in a vertical plane, what is the curve traced out by a point acted on only by gravity, which starts at A and reaches B in the shortest time?" Solved by the likes of Johann Bernoulli and Isaac Newton among others, the brachistochrone problem yields an elegant solution arising from fundamental physical laws and is touted as a prime example of beauty in mathematics.
