CNU Welcomes the Class of 2015



Last week we welcomed our first-year students. Hundreds of us - students and staff - were there to greet our new freshmen and their families and within minutes carry their possessions to their rooms. A great CNU tradition!

This is an outstanding group of young women and men who earned an average high school GPA of 3.7 - the highest number in our history.

50th Gala Celebration

CNU is celebrating our 50th Anniversary throughout 2011-12.

This will also be CNU's largest class of freshmen - more than 1,250 strong. Ninety-seven percent of our first-year students will live on campus, 94 percent of these students are Virginians, and students of color constitute 23 percent of the freshman class (including our largest number of African-Americans).

Leadership and Honors Class of 2015



This freshman class includes 28 Canon Scholars who earned, on average, a high school GPA of 4.1. Canon Scholars participate in the President's Leadership Program and receive a merit scholarship of \$5,000/year and the opportunity to study at Oxford.

The freshman class also includes 99 Smithfield and Goodwin Scholars with an average GPA of 4.0. Goodwin and Smithfield Scholars receive a scholarship of \$2,000/year, participate in the President's Leadership Program and receive a \$2,000 stipend toward foreign study.

In all, we will welcome 374 Leadership students, 80 more than last year, and they earned an average high school GPA of 3.9. Not only have these young women and men excelled in the classroom, but they have also excelled as good citizens and leaders. They

are class and club officers, team captains, section leaders, Eagle scouts, newspaper and yearbook editors, and students who have contributed countless hours of community service. They will bring this campus alive with their energy, enthusiasm and intellect.

I am also happy to report that 134 freshmen will participate in our Honors Program - up from 98 last fall. Of these, 102 will participate in both the Leadership and Honors programs - 32 in Honors alone. The average for all Honors students is a 4.0 GPA and 1303 SAT.

Remarkably, 406 freshmen - that's 32 percent of our first-year class - will participate in the President's Leadership Program and/or Honors Program.


