Could the Euro Implode?



In this lecture, Dr. Fratianni will speak about the current economic crisis in Europe. A panel of CNU faculty and students will follow the lecture. In 1999, when the European Monetary Union (EMU) was created, a critical piece was missing: a precise plan for implementing a fiscal union. The result was that EMU had a built-in fragility. This fragility was exposed first by the US subprime mortgage crisis of 2008-2009 and later by the European sovereign debt crisis. No comprehensive solution is in sight and European leaders are hoping for a deus ex machina (a miracle from God). The entire Hampton Roads community is invited.
