The Public History Center Presents: Exploring Fort Monroe: Virginia's Newest National Monument Tuesday, October 20 at 12:30 pm in MCM 101

Fort Monroe and nearby Old Point Comfort encompasses over four centuries of history, from Captain Christopher Newport's early explorations of the Chesapeake Bay area to the modern period. Known as "Freedom's Fortress," Fort Monroe acted as a safe haven for enslaved people during the Civil War, and is the location where the famous "contraband of war" decision was made--the first step towards emancipation. Robert Kelly, the Casemate Museum Historian at Fort Monroe and Vice-President of the Historical & Archaeological Society of Fort Monroe, will be discussing the significance of the fort and his career in museum work and historical preservation.






