In the late 19th century, German medical practices were considered to be the best in the world. But by the start of World War II, German physicians were directly involved in the mass killings of the Holocaust. After the war, a number of these physicians were tried for war crimes in Nuremberg. Hitler's personal physician, Karl Brandt, was the lead defendant in what was called the "Doctors' Trial."
