Nu Kappa Epsilon Constitution

Last revised March 10th, 2008

Nu Kappa Epsilon was established in the Spring of 1994 at the college of William and Mary to promote the growth and development of musical activities and appreciation on campus and in the community where chapters have been formed and to develop in the member the best qualities of character through music.

Article I - Name

A. The name of this organization shall be Nu Kappa Epsilon Music Sorority.

Article II – Objectives

A. The objectives of this organization shall be to promote the growth and development of musical activities and appreciation on the campus and in the community where each chapter has been formed, and to develop in the members the best qualities of character through music.

Article III – Membership

- A. Only female students in good standing with the respective institution who demonstrate a strong interest in music may be members of this organization. A sister may be an active or associate member. Each semester she must notify the president and secretary of her status before dues are due.
- B. An active member fulfills the attendance requirements of the sorority, as defined by the Constitution and her chapter's Bylaws.
- C. An associate sister is one who is unable to attend regular meetings due to class conflict or other circumstances. She is excused from meetings and committee credit, but is responsible for attending all other mandatory functions, as defined by the Constitution and her chapter's Bylaws. Associate sisterhood may only be maintained for two semesters during a sister's membership except in exceptional circumstances as reviewed by the appropriate chapter's Executive Board.
- D. An inactive sister is defined as a sister who chooses to withdraw her membership from the sorority. She must notify the president and secretary with a written statement declaring her inactive status. She may rejoin only at the discretion and majority vote of the sisterhood. A sister may not wear her NKE pin if she is inactive.
- E. If a sister does not pay her dues and does not declare her status for an entire semester, she may be declared inactive by the Executive Board.
