- Provide educational outreach and program efforts focused around honor

Membership

- Minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA
- Good academic standing
- Good social standing
- Minimum one-year commitment
- Meet member expectations

Responsibilities

- Adhere to all University policies and all city, state, and federal laws
- Attend meetings and required events
- Be professional and responsible during panels
- Ensure the rights and responsibilities of all CNU students and ensure that their rights to due process are protected

Time Commitment

- Meetings are held every other week and typically last about an hour
- There are 4 New Member Training Sessions that new members must attend. Each will last about an hour
- Panels occur as requested by a student throughout the semester and last about an hour, however, some are longer
- Occasional outreach programs or volunteer events
