Dr. Anthony Appiah is one of Foreign Policy's Top 100 global thinkers, and author of The Honor Code: How Moral Revolutions Happen and Cosmopolitism. Appiah specifically focuses on how ethics, particularly related to commerce and business, have developed and changed in a globalized society. Dr. Appiah is currently a professor of Philosophy and African-American Studies at Princeton University and has served as the president of the PEN-American Center, the country's largest human rights organization, for the past 3 years. Dr. Appiah challenges individuals and groups to consider how ethical leadership and actions can significantly affect the success of individuals and organizations while shaping society's norms and morals. He uses a current event approach to illustrate and motivate the audience to consider their roles and spheres of influence and encourages them to evaluate how ethical norms and values have been developed and maintained within their personal and professional involvements.
