Christopher Newport University is one of the nation's best institutions for undergraduate education, according to The Princeton Review, the



Wason Center Helps Redraw the Map



Christopher Newport University's Judy Ford Wason Center for Public Policy has enlisted 150 students from 13 campuses across the commonwealth to compete in a unique redistricting competition.

Redrawing political districts occurs every ten years following the release of new census data. The intent is create fair and equal representative districts.

CNU's Quentin Kidd, associate professor of political science and Director of the Wason Center, designed the competition primarily as an educational exercise. "The goal of the competition is to help educate both students and the public about the process of redistricting," said Dr. Kidd. "These student-drawn maps demonstrate alternative ways to draw Virginia's districts, which may be compared favorably or unfavorably to the maps produced by the state government."

Top proposals will be submitted to Gov. Bob McDonnell's Independent Bipartisan Advisory Commission on Redistricting.

Ask the President

Question:

Are there plans to develop a Neuroscience major at CNU?

Answer:

Yes, in fact CNU will offer a new undergraduate major in neuroscience in the 2011-2012 academic year. The scientific study of the brain, spinal cord, and sensory nerve network will involve existing CNU coursework in biology, chemistry, mathematics, physics, and psychology, in addition to new courses and labs on cutting edge research methods, on neurobiology, on the neurobiology of memory, and on neuroanatomy.

A just-recruited faculty member will spearhead this new curriculum in our College of Natural and Behavioral Sciences. Professor Katie Wiems received the Ph.D. in neuroscience from the University of Minnesota, one of the nation's most respected doctoral programs in this academic area. She is coming to CNU from Children's Hospital Los Angeles, where she completed a five-year post-doctoral fellowship to advance her expertise still further. Ms. Wiems is passionate about undergraduate teaching and eager to establish new laboratories in our new science center - Forbes Hall - that will directly involve our undergraduate students.
