November 7, 2015

This conference on civic movements and democracy seeks to explore the ways that citizens of all countries are able to make their voices heard for the common good. In fields as diverse as civil rights, the environment, the peace movement, women's struggle for equality or the quest for world peace, active citizens have made an important impact on their societies by uniting together in civic movements for change.

Although great strides in human freedom are often associated with charismatic leaders like Martin Luther King, Aung San Suu Kyi, Rachel Carson or Mahatma Gandhi, ordinary citizens—like Rosa Parks or Malala Yousafzai—when working together with others can create meaningful social change.

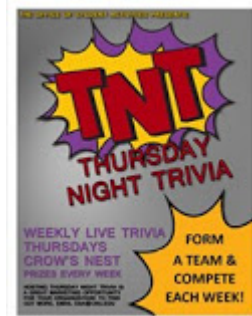
