What is Polio Disease?

--Polio is a highly contagious disease caused by a virus that attacks the nervous system. A polio vaccine is given to a child and in return the child's pinkie is colored purple with a topical solution and temporarily marking him to prevent double dosage on National Immunization Days (NID).

Who is Likely to get the Disease?

--Thanks to the polio vaccine, the U.S. has not had a reported case of polio since 1979. However, Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Nigeria still have frequent outbreaks.
