Poet Laureate of Virginia to Speak at CNU®





Applications for the Class of 2007 Remain Strong!



To 4790 date students have 1658 applied, students have been accepted and 435 students have already indicated they will attend. The SAT average these of "ves" students is 1160; last year our entering class had an SAT average of 1122.

To date 32 students have accepted our invitation to be members of the President's Leadership Program and their SAT average is 1212 and their high school GPA is 3.7.

This spring we are hosting 10 special admissions events on campus including 3 open houses, 2 Honor Day visits, minority students day and special events for students interested in studying business, computer science, psychology and biology.

On March 14 and 15, we welcomed 100 minority students and family to our first minority student weekend. This year a Task Force on Minority Admissions, composed of students, faculty, staff, community leaders and board members, has met regularly to determine how CNU can more effectively identify, cultivate and enroll greater numbers of strong minority students.
