## **Veteran Rights and Awareness Training** August 8, 2014 from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.

HR is partnering with the Attorney General's Office to bring a special training opportunity to campus. Attendees will learn about post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and traumatic Brain injury (TBI) as they relate to the workplace. Topics will include valuable information on the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA) (the federal law that protects the civilian employment of military personnel who are Guard, Reserve, or active duty personnel and who do not spend a cumulative of more than 5 years away from their employer as a result of military duty) and a presentation on the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008 as it relates to military service-members. Moreover, the Regional Coordinator for Region V (Hampton Roads) from the Virginia Wounded Warrior Program will be a guest speaker.
