Using Interlibrary Loan @ CNU by Jesse Spencer, Interlibrary Loan Librarian

Interlibrary Loan is one of the more important services here at CNU. If you aren’t using it, why aren’t you? CNU’s Interlibrary Loan (ILL) service enables you to borrow materials not held here at Tribble Library. If a DVD or CD is checked out, if it is the wrong edition, or if we do not hold it at all, you may use Interlibrary Loan to borrow the item. Click on the Interlibrary Loan link on the library homepage. If you have not used ILL before, go to the first-time user registration webpage found in the ILL Libguide. After reading disclaimers and filling out the web form with your personal information, you are ready to locate and request that media item we did not have at Tribble Library.

To find the item, click on the WorldCat link below the catalog box on the library homepage. Perform your search using the information you have on hand. Once you locate your desired item, click on the ILLiad icon. When prompted, log in, and the information is automatically filled out for you. Enter N/A in the volume, issue, page number, and article title fields since you are

actually making a loan request. Click the “submit request” button. Alternatively, in ILLiad, you can use the Other (Free Field) Request form to type in your citation information and any notes you might have.

Not all libraries are eager to lend their audiovisual materials. There are often conditions placed on the use of the item, such as restricting the use to the library or shortening the checkout period to two weeks. Renewals are almost never granted. Give yourself plenty of time, as the request may have to be sent out to multiple libraries.

ILL can help you with a research project or help you have access to nearly any item the CNU library does not own. Give it a try if you haven’t already! ☺
