All are invited to the second CSS Scholarship Series, featuring Dr. Antonia Randolph, on Friday, February 7 from 4 – 6 PM in the Luter Hall Atrium (3<sup>rd</sup>Floor). Beer, wine, and light fare will be provided.

Dr. Randolph will be discussing her recent book, *The Wrong Kind of Different:* Challenging the Meaning of Diversity in American Classrooms. In this book, Dr. Randolph explores how teachers perceive students from diverse racial and ethnic backgrounds and the unintended consequences of a kind of "colorblind multiculturalism." She unearths a hierarchy of acceptance and legitimacy that excludes most poor Black students and favors certain immigrant minorities. In addition, Randolph discovers how some teachers distinguish their support for certain forms of student diversity from curriculum diversity, such as accommodating bilingual education, which they find burdensome.
