"Rāgas and Riches: Indian Music in Hindu Worship and Beyond"

In this lecture and demonstration, Dr. Beck will first describe the history and mythic origins of Indian music, and then introduce the practical art of meditation on sacred sound through music. With an emphasis on voice culture and the production of the pure note, the audience will experience an aesthetic sense of the concept of rasa and an appreciation of the structure and beauty of a raga (a unique melodic pattern) and the tala (rhythm). Building upon this foundation, Dr. Beck will also demonstrate how other religions in South Asia like Buddhism, Sikhism, Islam, and even Christianity have adopted aspects of Indian music in their worship.
