- I. Call to Order 3:06 p.m. by President Siochi
- II. President's Report
  - A. President Siochi is trying to arrange a meeting with President Trible for the week of 29 January 2002.
  - B. The Academic Status Committee has completed its work on the proposed changes.
  - C. The Handbook Committee sent in the changes this morning.
  - D. The Senate Meeting schedule for the Spring 2002 semester is as follows:

## III. Committee Reports

- A. Elections Committee Report
  - Senator Winder explained that the restructuring of the University into CLAS and ScB necessitated a review of the election process for the faculty senate and standing committees.
  - 2. The EC determined that there are three relatively equal (in terms of number of faculty) subdivisions of CLAS. These are:
    - a. <u>Liberal arts</u> (57 faculty) containing Communications Studies, English, Fine and Performing Arts, Modern and Classical Languages, Philosophy and Religious Studies and Library Science
    - b. <u>Social science and professional studies</u> (57 faculty) containing Education, Government and Public Affairs, History, Psychology, Recreation, Sociology and Social Work
    - c. <u>Science and technology</u> (51 faculty) containing Biology,
      Chemistry, and Environmental Science, Mathematics, Nursing,
      Physics and Computer Science
  - 3. The School of Business is the remaining subdivision of the university. (26 faculty) containing Accounting, Management and Marketing, and Economics and Finance

- 4. As of yet, it has not been determined what subdivision will incorporate Military Science (5 faculty).
- 5. The EC also considered whether the Senate should be made up of 3/4 or 2/3 tenured professors.
- 6. The EC determined that more discussion would be required as to the mode of transition from the old Senate structure to the new.
- 7. All CNU faculty are encouraged to email Senator Winder with questions and comments.
- 8. The matter was tabled and placed on the agenda for the Senate meeting scheduled for 8 February 2002.
- B. The Faculty Leadership Development Committee has scheduled a meeting.

## IV. New Business

- A. CNU Faculty Response to the State Budget Crisis
  - 1. Dr. Doughty's email message concerning Faculty election/selection on the Curriculum and Academic Life Committee was discussed.
  - 2. The recommended cuts for the next biennium (i.e. the additional 1% for 2002; 7% for 2003; and 8% for 2004) are due in Richmond 7 February 2002.
  - 3. Senators Purtle and Schell commented on the structure, meeting schedule and deadlines of the Budget Committee appointed by President Trible.
  - 4. Senators Purtle and Schell commented that the committee welcomes and carefully examines all correspondence sent by email. Time and fairness concerns prohibit face to face meetings with individual faculty members.

- B. Senator Broscious move to send a copy of the Senate resolution concerning the creation and composition of the Curriculum and Academic Life Committee be sent to the faculty.

- C. The Senate requests that President Siochi set up regular meetings between the Senate Executive Committee and members of the administration to cultivate a dialogue, which would ideally advance the implementation and effectiveness of shared governance at CNU.
