APPROVAL OF REVISED COMPREHENSIVE FEE

Christopher Newport College

At the present time the tuition and fee schedule at Christopher Newport College consists of the following:

In-State Students

Tuition \$18 per semester hour of credit
Comprehensive Fee \$2 per semester hour of credit

Out-of-State Students

Tuition \$28 per semester hour of credit
Comprehensive Fee \$2 per semester hour of credit

The comprehensive fee consists of a construction fee for the new Campus Center and a student activities fee. The schedule is on a per semester hour of credit basis, but levels off at 15 hours for both in-state and out-of-state students.

The proposed revised schedule, as described below, provides for the tuition rate to remain the same, and for the comprehensive fee rate to increase by \$1 to \$3 per semester hour of credit.

In-State Students

Tuition \$18 per semester hour of credit Comprehensive Fee \$3 per semester hour of credit

Out-of-State Students

Tuition \$28 per semester hour of credit
Comprehensive Fee \$3 per semester hour of credit

The proposed schedule will also level off at 15 semester hours of credit for both in-state and out-of-state students.

The additional funds generated by the \$1 per semester hour of credit increase are needed to support an expanding student activities program which will become possible with the completion of the new Campus Center, and to provide for a parking fee as part of the Comprehensive Fee.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Comprehensive Fee at Christopher Newport College be \$3 per semester hour of credit for both in-state and out-of-state students, effective September 1, 1973.

WHEREAS, certain real property owned by the United States, located in Newport News Virginia, has been declared surplus and is subject to assignment for disposal for educational or public health purposes by the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare, under the provisions of Section 203(k)(1) of the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949 (63 Stat. 377) as amended, and rules and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto, more particularly described as follows:

Portion of Fort Eustis, Virginia, known as Goose Island, comprising 79.30 acres of unimproved land. Property is located in Newport News, Virginia, 1000 ft. west of Fort Eustis, on the southerly side of Skiffes Creek Channel in the James River.

Whereas, Christopher Newport College of The College of William and Mary in Virginia, needs and will utilize said property for Educational purposes as set forth in its application and in accordance with the requirements of said Act and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, of which this Board is fully informed:

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that Christopher Newport College of The College of William and Mary in Virginia, shall make application to the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare, for and secure the transfer to it of the above-mentioned property for said use upon and subject to such exceptions, reservations, terms, covenants, agreements, conditions, and restrictions as the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare, or his authorized representative, may require in connection with the disposal of said property under said Act and the rules and regulations issued pursuant thereto; and

Be It Further Resolved that Christopher Newport College of The College of William and Mary in Virginia, has legal authority, is willing and is in a position to assume immediate care and maintenance of the property, and that Dr. James C. Windsor, President, be and he is hereby authorized, for and on behalf of Christopher Newport College of The College of William and Mary in Virginia, to do and perform any and all acts and things which may be necessary to carry out the foregoing resolution, including the preparing, making, and filing of plans, applications, reports, and other documents, the execution, acceptance, delivery, and recordation of agreements, deeds, and other instruments pertaining to the transfer of said property, including the filing of copies of the application and the conveyance documents in the records of the Board, and the payment of any and all sums necessary on account of the purchase price thereof or fees (including the service charge, if any, assessed by the State Agency for Surplus Property) or costs incurred in connection with the transfer of said property for surveys, title searches, appraisals, recordation of instruments, or escrow costs.
