




CHRISTOPHER NEWPORT

41 STUDENT CENTER
COMPLETED IN 1973

The Student Center held student spaces such as a cafeteria and the original John Gaines Theatre. The first addition to the campus center was completed in 1983 and almost doubled in size with completion of the second addition in 1984.



21 RATCLIFFE GYMNASIUM COMPLETED IN 1967

CNC's third building was home to the gymnasium. Now known as Ratcliffe Hall, it still stands in the same location and houses athletics and IT facilities.



GOSNOLD HALL COMPLETED IN 1965

The completion of CNC's second building marked the end of use of the Daniel School building. Gosnold served as the college's science building.



40 SCIENCE BUILDING
COMPLETED IN 1985

The science building was built to accommodate the rapidly growing needs of the institution, including the greatly expanded departments of biology, chemistry and environmental science.



CHRISTOPHER NEWPORT HALL
COMPLETED IN 1964

Christopher Newport Hall was the first building completed on the Shoe Lane campus and served multiple purposes over the years.



WINGFIELD HALL
COMPLETED IN 1970

Wingfield was the fifth and final building of the first phase of CNC's campus, and was occupied by the modern language and psychology departments.



35 ADMINISTRATION BUILDING COMPLETED IN 1980

The first four-story building at Christopher Newport College, the Administration Building was completed in 1980 to accommodate the growing and now-independent four-year college.



36 CAPTAIN JOHN SMITH LIBRARY COMPLETED IN 1967

The fourth building of CNC's campus served as an administration building and the campus library. Trible Library now stands on the foundation of Captain John Smith Library.



JAPANESE TEAHOUSE COMPLETED IN 1988

The Teahouse was the centerpiece of an exhibition at the National Gallery of Art showcasing the importance of the tea ceremony in Japanese culture. In 1989, fundraising efforts enabled it to be moved to Christopher Newport.
