## "I Don't Want To Shoot Them, But What Can I Do?"

Thursday, April 14th at 6:00pm in Luter Hall Room 121

Join us for a thought-provoking discussion of Hidden struggles of living with elephants in Botswana on April 14 at 6:00 PM in Luter Hall, Room 121. This talk seeks to elucidate the hidden costs and challenges of living with elephants by engaging more fully with the complex reality of conservation on the ground in rural Botswana. Characterizing this struggle are competing notions of animal and human rights - around who is worth protecting, at what cost, and for what purpose. This is an Honors and PLP recognized event and free and open to the public.

After a semester of hard work, students from ENGL 350: Writing for the Digital Humanities are ready to showcase their digital activism and advocacy projects! 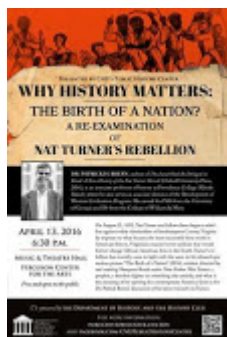
